## LSAC GOES TO CHURCH - 21 February 2009

This was bordering on religion for some of us as it was a trip to the Church End Brewery in Nuneaton, one of, if not the most renowned Real Ale Breweries in the area! The visit was first discussed towards the end of last year at the Pete Barnard Beer Festival, or should that be Broughton Astley Beer festival? Kath came up with the idea about the visit, which was wholeheartedly supported by all present!

With a due start time of 7pm us southerners made an early start as Nuneaton is uncharted territory for us. Armed with an internet sourced AA route we promptly got lost, I think, in Nuneaton. But who knows with Nuneaton being, well, Nuneaton! To get directions we pulled in at, would you believe, a pub. Following the Landlords instructions to go 'right out of the car park then first road on the right and up through the trees' I thought we were on a special stage in a car rally. By now I was beginning to wonder if I was going to miss the main event but luckily the 'beer hunter's instinct' took over and although we seemed to be entering a private housing area, I saw what could have been a sign. Often at these events the food is preceded by the Brewery tour but it was the reverse on this occasion, which gave us time to start sampling some of the 'Religious Offerings'. We were shown to a table reserved for us where we were served our food, which proved perfectly adequate for soaking up the beer. During the evening Fran was elected photographer so I am hoping she will provide photographs proving who was there. I think there were about fourteen of us but the numbers changed depending what stage of the evening it was/how many 'samplers' I'd consumed.



There then followed the Brewery tour where we were shown how Church End Brewery make their unique brews. Most of their ales have a distinctively bitterness which is a result of the continental hops used as opposed to ales brewed using English hops which have a more subtle flavour. It was interesting from a producers perspective that Church End use Maris Otter barley as their main source of brewing malt as this variety of barley was first introduced over twenty years ago. Like most varieties that have exceptional brewing qualities

they have a major downside, in that they suffer from all the major diseases and are thus expensive to grow. Here endeth the sermon showing that at least I was listening!



We then adjourned to the social area where more sampling of the different Church End ales took place as most of us had not



decided which one was our personal favourite!  
Richard Sykes and I decided that it would take another visit to narrow it down but then they would have a different selection of ales on tap. Unfortunate!!



As the evening headed towards its ultimate 'Last orders' we all agreed what a great night we had had. None more so than Mr Barnardo who thorough the evening had had a steady flow of sampler trays brought to him. I eventually took pity on him and volunteered to help him out to which he reluctantly agreed!



The Barnados were unsure as to the way back home so elected to follow us which must surely be the ultimate case of the blind leading the blind but it seemed to work ok although I have not heard from Pete, Indra or Fran since!!

It only remains for me to thank those responsible for organising the evening namely Kath and Rich Hall.
